President's Message

This morning, while contemplating what I might have to donate to the upcoming Conclave's silent auction, I (re)- discovered on my messy bookshelf my copy of Gerald Hayes' "The Viols and Other Bowed Instruments", which I think I purchased in London in the early 1970's. The first edition of this scholarly work was printed a year earlier, in 1969, a year which some viol players may regard as being in the remotest past, but with which I have some intimate familiarity. "The Viols..." was at the time regarded as **THE** authoritative source for detailed information about the instrument, and contains several lengthy chapters about its construction, tuning, playing technique, and repertory. What is curiously missing, however, is an equally detailed discussion of the instruments origins and early history. One finds, of course, many vague and discreet allusions and considerable speculation on that point, but astonishingly few specifics. The reader's eye rolls off the pages as it searches in vain for dates or locations.

In the intervening forty-plus years, much diligent research – and doubtless several DMA and PhD dissertations – managed to fill in most of those blanks. The book's value now is mostly as a historical artifact, so it's definitely going to the VdGSA auction stack. You're all welcome to bid on it; it has a lovely moss-green cover, and it's printed on excellent paper!

It goes almost without saying that a profound commitment to our beloved viol over the course of many years was necessary to research and document the more complete information we now have about the instrument. And that effort would very likely not have been invested had the viol not garnered such affection among its hundreds, perhaps thousands, of devotees world-wide. I hope you're all planning to attend this year's Conclave in Forest Grove, Oregon, to celebrate and share that affection with your fellow devotees.

May 11th is our final Play Day of the season, and we are extremely pleased to have Josh Lee, a fine player and teacher from San Francisco, as our presenter. As with Joanna Blendulf earlier this season, Josh comes to us as a result of the board's decision last year to ensure that some presenters and teachers from a broader geographical area would be included in the Play Day season. I'm sure Josh's presentation, and coaching in the afternoon, will be both energetic and inspirational.

We'll hold our annual members' meeting that same day, at the modest cost of a slightly shorter lunch period. As always, the board eagerly awaits your questions and comments. We also have for your consideration two candidates for election to the board: Bill Warren, and Michael King. Noreen Jacky has opted to take a sabbatical from her board duties, though she's eager to support the program committee's activities as a non-board-member. Cited for his "stylish and soulful playing," **Josh Lee** performs on viols and double bass with some of the world's leaders in early music. Josh is an alumn of the Peabody Conservatory and the Longy School of Music where he studied double bass with Harold Hall Robinson and viol with Ann Marie Morgan and Jane Hershey. Founder of the ensemble Ostraka, he is a member of Musica Pacifica and has performed with the Los Angeles Philharmonic, Carmel Bach Festival, Boston Early Music Festival Orchestra, American Bach Soloists, Les Délices, and Philharmonia Baroque Orchestra. Josh's performances have been heard on National Public Radio's *Performance Today* and *Harmonia*, and he has recorded for Dorian, Koch International and

Reference Recordings. Recently praised as "a master of the score's wandering and acrobatic itinerary" by the Cleveland Plain Dealer, Josh is director of the Viola da Gamba Society of America Young Players' Weekend.



And here is what I plan on working on with the large grand consort:

We will start the day with a group warm up, where I'll review some left hand and bowing exercises to bring a sense of body awareness to your practice. Having struggled to recover from a serious left hand injury over the past year, I think we often don't listen to our bodies as we pursue the music we love. Please come to the play day with questions in mind particular to yourself and your experience with the viol - and I'll do the best to help you make playing less painful.
